#### CHRISTMAS BEGINS WITH CHRIST

Advent is the four-week season in December when the church reflects on the significance of the Advent of Christ and His expected Second Coming.

Each Sunday morning, we will light an Advent candle focusing on the theme of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Christians of all denominations celebrate Advent in their own way, but all focus on Jesus' birth and the meaning of His life.

#### **BLESSING BOX**

In the month of November the Blessing Box was used 34 times. It is stocked with nonperishable food that is available for those who need it. The things that have been taken are meat products (Vienna sausage, tuna, canned chicken, and peanut butter), crackers or bread, ramen noodles, mac & cheese, various mixes for seasoning, soup, individual servings of fruit, oatmeal or pudding, cornbread mix, juice boxes and breakfast bars. A list of things taken from the Blessing Box is posted on the bulletin board in the fellowship hall, along with the prayer requests that have been left in the Blessing Box. We are also putting scripture verses on each item.

Some people who do not attend MCC are helping stock the box and we thank them for the help. We always need some supplies for the Blessing Box and would appreciate your help in this area. Some things we need at this time are: mac & cheese, small cans of tuna, individual pudding, individual fruit, or oatmeal, pasta and pasta sauce. As the weather gets cooler, individual packs of cocoa would be useful too. Thanks!
